



My name is Clarisse. But when I was born, my parents named me Kang, after my father. I was scared to tell them that my gender identity is female, but I was fortunate. They accepted the real me. What they can't accept is that, as an HIV positive person, I may not always have access to the drugs that are keeping me alive. In my state, the AIDS Drug Assistance Program is considering limits on patient access. I'd like to tell my parents that I will lead a long and productive life, but I'm not so sure that's true.

Ensure that Clarisse can continue to lead a productive life. Help states remove limitations on enrollment in their HIV medication programs for all eligible participants.
